2 Work with a partner. Look at the video title and the words in the box. Which words do you think you will hear in the video? Discuss your reasons.

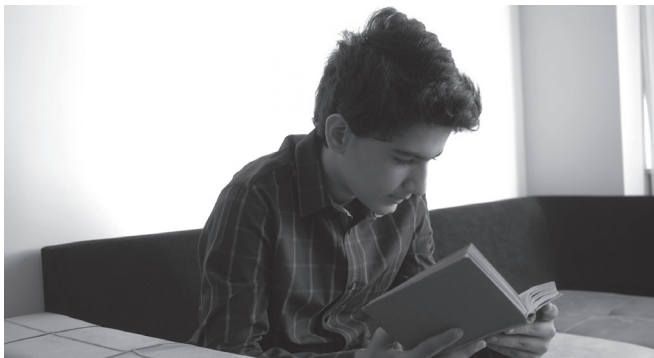
